

**Study Questions for the May 9, 2021 Sermon:
“Teaching the Next Generation”
Deuteronomy 4:5-9**

1. Moses taught that God's law was applicable to the journey ahead into the promised land (*...I have taught you statutes ...that you should do them in the land that you are entering...*). The law was not just for the 40 years of wandering. What would you say to someone who believes that Biblical law does not incorporate the understanding of human nature that people now possess?
2. Verse 9 emphasizes the importance of sharing our faith with children.
 - a. What are some effective ways of passing-on our faith?
 - b. Share a way in which you, as a child, learned scriptural principles.
3. Verse 9 also admonishes the reader to *keep your soul diligently*.
 - a. What does “keep your soul” mean?
 - b. How do we “keep our soul”?
4. Ideally, Bible study should change our hearts (character and values) rather than just educating us. How do we move the knowledge we acquire during Bible study to from our heads to our hearts?
5. “...one of Satan's great strategies is to make us remember what we should forget, and forget what we should remember.” David Guzik. Look at verse 3, as well as 5 – 9. What did Moses want the people to remember?
