

**Study Questions for the May 23, 2021 Sermon:
“Why do Christians Sing?”
Habakkuk 3:1-11**

1. Worship services include song, prayer, and sermons. Talk about which part is your favorite.
2. Are there songs, or is there a single song, that you treasured in your heart during a time of adversity?
3. The song/prayer of Habakkuk may have been prophetic, historical, or both. To what historical events may the song be alluding?
 - a. His splendor covered the heavens, and the earth was full off his praise.
 - b. His brightness was like the light; and rays flashed from his hand; and there he veiled his power.
 - c. Before him went pestilence, and plague followed at his heels.
 - d. The mountains saw you and writhed; the raging waters swept on; the deep gave forth its voice; it lifted its hands on high.
 - e. The sun and moon stood still in their place.
4. Verses 10 and 11 describe how nature itself responds to the power of God. Where is this seen in the:
 - a. Old Testament?
 - b. New Testament?
